Vice President and Dean's Report – Dr. Richardson updated the council on the location of the marijuana site on Highland in the old Pepsi facility. Now the concern is for the security of the facility. Dr. Tobey Lepley from Texas A&M is the new Associate Vice President and Program Leader for 4-H Youth Development. He begins working and shadowing Mark Tassin April 1st. The special session begins Monday, February 19th at 4:00pm. A \$900 million budget shortfall could be fixed by continuing the one-cent sales tax. The AgCenter is watching agriculture exemptions. The College of Ag's enrollment is up 28%. Since tuition is more than \$5,000, we are watching to assure TOPS continues. Congratulations on Dr. King's speech yesterday that was viewed by Acano. Dr. Phil Elzer is the college's new Executive Associate Dean. Dr. Richardson mentioned he visited the Avoyelles parish office unannounced and was pleased to see all agents in the field. He visited with the administrative coordinator. The roso cane project will receive funding from AFAS. While in D.C., Secretary Perdue mentioned he would like to come see the roso cane project. USDA is focusing on rural infrastructure. Our Center for Ag Science and Rural Development fits in perfectly to President Trump's infrastructure initiative. There are 1,000+ acres in St. Gabriel that will be used to do wetlands mitigation. Dr. Richardson mentioned what a great project that is since RNR will get biological property to utilize into teaching and research. The AgCenter owns the property. It is not to be used for grazing nor farming. The Board of Supervisors approved the wetlands mitigation concept.

Invited Guest- No guest invited this month. Ann Coulon will join us in March.

<u>Business</u> – Sun Jo did not send out the minutes. The council was unable to vote on them. He mentioned he would email them to all members and call for a vote.

<u>Reports</u>

 Sun Jo mentioned Becky Gautreaux, Ken McMillin, and he attended the Board of Supervisors meeting on February 2, 2018. Becky reported the Provost acknowledged Dr. Ken McMillian on his accomplishment of changing the general education curriculum. New Orleans received a bachelor's of Public Health. The school only had a Master of Public Health. The board members discussed their tour of the campus and noticed the deferred maintenance issues such as absence of air conditioning in the Studio Arts building. LSUS wants to purchase a radio station in Arkansas with funding coming from the Red River Radio Station. The board approved to investigate the building purchase. The board approved to continue David Ram's (football defensive coordinator) contract and his salary at \$2.5 million/year for 4 years. The board also approved to let Matt Canada go.

- Dr. Phil Elzer is the Executive Associate Dean of the College. There were 25 applicants. The council members sitting on the Search Committee agreed to remove "Executive" from future job searches due to the amount of unqualified individuals. Chuanlan Liu suggested inviting Dr. Elzer to a meeting now that he is Executive Associate Dean.
- Only some members viewed Dr. King Alexander's speech yesterday. Becky Gautreaux spoke to IT to play the recording for those who had not seen it. The council watched Dr. King's speech.
- Denise Holston-West was absent and could not report on the search for the 4-H Program Leader.

Discussion Items
