## October Trade Data Released

The record-setting pace of 2014 Southern Pine exports continues. USDA's Foreign Agricultural Service recently reported SP exports to be approximately 54.2 million board feet (MMbf) during October 2014. This volume represents a generous increase of 23% above the same month last year, and a significant year-to-date boost of 21% when compared with the first ten months of 2013. Offshore shipments during October roughly break down as follows: 27.6 MMbf dressed, 10.2 MMbf rough, and 16.4 MMbf treated lumber.

Softwood lumber imports to the U.S. during October were just over one billion board feet, up 23% from the volume imported during October of 2013. Year-to-date softwood imports are up twelve percent when compared with last year. As usual, Canada shipped the great majority of softwood lumber into the U.S. during October.
